Public Comment

There was no public comment.

Endorse Draft FYs 2020-2021 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) for Public Review

Mr. Sean Pfalzer, MPO Coordinator, said that the UPWP is the operating budget and shows the planning efforts for the coming year. He said that TDOT and FHWA have reviewed it and their comments will be incorporated into the document prior to the public review and comment period.

The Transportation Policy Board (TPB) will adopt the document at their August 21st meeting after it has been out for the required 14-day public review and comment period.

A clarifying question was asked and answered.

Mr. Bill McCord moved to endorse the FYs 2020-2021 UPWP for public review and comment. Ms. Billy Higgins seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Public Hearing for Amendments to the FYs 2017-2020 TIP

Ms. Anna Emerson, MPO Staff, said that the amendments are out for the required 21-day public review and comment period.

Several clarifying questions were asked and answered.

Mr. Briggs opened the public hearing. There was no public comment. Mr. Briggs closed the public hearing.

Mr. Tom Brashear moved to endorse the amendments for consideration for adoption by the TPB with Mr. Andy Barlow seconding. The motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Emerson noted that the Cycle D of amendments for this TIP will be done in September. She said that amendment requests need to be submitted to her by August 21st.

Election of TCC Officers for 2019-2020 Year

Mr. Mike Harris presented the slate of officers for consideration: Mr. Michael Briggs for Chair and Mr. Glenn Harper for Vice-Chair. There were no nominations from the floor.

Mr. Brashear moved to accept the slate as presented. Mr. Doug Demosi seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Update on the Draft TIP for FYs 2020-2023

Ms. Emerson said that the draft of the draft FYs 2020-2023 has been reviewed by TDOT and their comments have been received. She noted that the biggest change will be a large portion of TDOT projects identified for programming in 2023 will be removed for now.

The timeline is for adoption of the new TIP in October. She said that the members can review the draft TIP. She reminded the members to complete the survey on ADA transition plans. This information must be documented in the new TIP. Also, letters showing proof of local match for projects are needed.

Mr. Josh Suddath asked about the ramifications of ADA tracking. Ms. Emerson said that there are no real ramifications. Mr. Sean Santalla said it is important to see that progress is being made. There is no blanket policy. It is on a case by case basis. All MPOs in the state must include this information in their TIPs.

Mr. Pfalzer said that a workshop may be scheduled for next month to work through any final updates.

Overview of the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan Process

Mr. Pfalzer said that the new 2045 RTP will be done over the next 12 to 18 months, with adoption scheduled for February 2021. It will build off the last RTP and include many of the same core components: establishing a policy framework, documenting the existing conditions, identifying issues facing the region, forecasting the future impact of growth and development on the transportation system, and evaluating the investments that are available and prioritizing the list of investments based on available funding.

He briefly went over the schedule for adoption and the studies that are underway. He said that we are looking for the members to review and give input for the policy framework by next month.

A draft plan will be done by the summer of 2020. The RTP is an opportunity to integrate processes: 1) Congestion Management Process, 2) Planning and Environmental Linkages, 3) Equity Atlas, and 4) Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy.

Mr. Pfalzer said that the TCC will continue to get updated on the process. He said that input on the policy framework is important and will likely include feedback through a survey and future workshop.

Mr. McCord said that the framework needed to be addressed before a call for projects is issued.

Mr. Briggs said that this process provides an opportunity to revisit a regional safety goal. Mr. Brashear asked if there is a matrix for supporting the hands-free legislation passed by Tennessee.

Update on Federal Certification Review

Mr. Pfalzer said that three of the corrective actions required in the last certification have been satisfied. He said that the fourth corrective, an update of the Congestion Management Process (CMP), will be integrated into the new RTP development. A letter to FHWA to extend the deadline for the CMP update to February 2021 has been submitted and we are awaiting a response.

Chair's Report

Mr. Briggs reminded the members of the Fall TAPA conference is October 9-11 in Franklin.

Staff Report

Mr. Pfalzer said that the new GNRC website is up and running. He said that for now both the MPO and the GNRC websites will be up.

Mr. Pfalzer said that round two of the South Corridor meetings will be held the last week of August. There will be a Joint Steering Committee meeting on August 16th at the Brentwood Public Library.

Mr. Pfalzer told the members that the GNRC Annual meeting will be on September 25th in Hendersonville.

Mr. Pfalzer introduced the new hire, Ms. Mary Turner, who is working on land use and transportation. Mr. Michael Skipper said that she is helping local jurisdictions with their comprehensive planning efforts and with right-of-way preservations. Also, Ms. Carson Cooper will begin the end of August. She will be working on the Research and Analytics team and focusing on the Equity Atlas.

Ms. Shelly Hazle said that the Cumberland Region Tomorrow's Power of 10 will be October 3rd. Go to https://www.cumberlandregiontomorrow.org/ for more information.

Mr. Skipper asked the members to hold either October 23rd or October 30th (date not certain yet) for a Transportation Summit for the kick-off of the RTP update.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:35 a.m.

Components of the Nashville Area TIP


- Adoption Resolution A signed resolution documenting action of the Transportation Policy Board (TPB) to adopt the program.
- Self Certification A signed statement certifying that the transportation planning process is carried out in accordance with all applicable requirements.
- General Documentation Describes federal requirements, relationship to statewide programming, revenue assumptions, project prioritization and selection process, and community engagement process.
- Programming Policies Specific rules and guidelines set by the TPB for developing and managing the TIP.
- Financial Plan Demonstration of fiscal constraint and a balanced TIP budget for each grant program and fiscal year
- Project Sheets Detailed project information including description of location, scope
 of work, costs, schedule, and project development phases planned during the TIP.
- Prior TIP Project Status Report Documentation of the last known status of each project in the prior program.



Requests of Project Proponents

- Review Draft TIP Review draft TIP documentation prior to adoption
- Comment on Draft TIP Take survey on draft TIP
- ADA Tracking Respond to survey with status of local ADA Transition Plan status
- **Documentation of Local Match** Document proof of local matching funds within 3 months of program year






By Project Type




By Phase of Work

- February 15: Local deadline to submit information for existing TIP projects
- March 15: Local deadline to submit abstracts for new projects from RTP
- April 12: Local deadline to submit applications for new projects from RTP
- May 15: TDOT deadline to submit state projects for new TIP
- May 17: MPO membership workshop to review TIP development
- June 5: Presentation of draft TIP projects to TCC
- June 19: Presentation of draft TIP projects to TPB
- June-Aug: Formal review by agency partners, TDOT, FHWA, and FTA
- September-Oct: Public review and comment period
- October 16: Formal adoption by TPB
- December 5: TDOT submission of TIP/STIP to FHWA and FTA
- January 15, 2020: Approval of STIP (TIP incorporated by reference)
